1. Are you Single.
2. Are you a Divorcee.
3. Are you a Widow (female) / Widower (male).
4. Are you a (clinical) Virgin?
5. What Religion are you?
6. Are you actively practicing your Religion?
7. Have you now or in the past one or more close friends which you share regular time with, and are they of the opposite gender or the same?
8. How many languages do you speak, and which language did you speak in your home growing up?
9. What level of formal education have you attained to this day?
10. Have you future education plans, if so what is your plans for accomplishing this education?
11. What are your plans for care of your own physical health and that of your future spouse and future children, do have you a strategy in place that in the event of ill physical health of a family member what you will do?
12. What are your attitudes towards pre-marital sexual intimacy?
13. How many pre-marital sexual partners have you experienced, and do you possess a comprehensive list of each one?
14. Have you ever thought about, when after you are married, would you engage in extra-marital sexual relations outside your marriage in addition to your new marriage mate?
15. Did you ever cheat on your former partner/spouse without his/her knowing it?
16. Do you want children, if so how many?
17. How have you prepared yourself financially for your future spouse and your future children?
18. Are you a member of a political party, if so which one and why?
19. What are your plans for educating your future unborn children?
20. Are your parents alive?
21. What is/was the Religion of both your parents?
22. Are you an only child, or how many siblings do you have and which numbered one are you?
23. How will your parents and siblings (if any) be involved with you after you are married, and what are your expectations as part of your parents extended family?
24. When you are married, and you find you are having a problem situation within your marriage relationship, how will you deal with it, what is the first thing you will do?
25. Are you open to seeking the help you need inside your marriage yet outside your traditional religion and personally held beliefs in order to save your marriage; to help it to grow stronger in maturity through the marital challenges you will encounter?
